BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

MARTHA SHARP JOUKOWSKY attended Brown University, and obtained her A.B. in Classics from New York University, and her M.A. in archaeology from the American University in Beirut. She anticipates the defense of her Ph.D. (*Doctorat d'État*) from the University of Paris I in June 1982. She resides part of the year in her Cotton Valley, St. Croix, home, teaching at Brown University during the academic year.

DARRELL ADDISON POSEY received his Ph.D. in anthropology from the University of Georgia in 1979. Currently he is Mellon Visiting Professor at the Center for Latin American Studies, University of Pittsburgh. He has published on various topics concerning folk taxonomic systems, folk biology and ethnoentomology. He is a founder of the *Journal of Ethnobiology*, for which he serves on the Editorial Board.

GEORGE FREDERICK TYSON, JR. is a native of Davenport, Iowa. He took his B.A. at the University of Southern California, and his M.A. in history at Columbia University. Associated for some years with Island Resources Foundation, he teaches at the College of the Virgin Islands since 1979. He is the author of several books and articles on the history of the Caribbean.

GARY STOCKTON VESCELIUS is a native of Montclair, New Jersey. His uncle, Harry E. Taylor, was Administrator of St. Croix for many years, so Gary was drawn to the Virgin Islands at an early age. While still an undergraduate at Yale University, Vescelius conducted an extensive archaeological survey of St. Croix, which became his Honors Thesis in the Scholar of the House program. Later, he attended the University of Michigan, where he earned a M.A. in anthropology. After much field work in Peru, Gary S. Vescelius became the second Territorial Archaeologist of the Virgin Islands of the United States (1975-1979). He is now a consultant in archaeology.
